The mission of the Office for Diversity Inclusion and Community Partnership (DICP) is to advance diversity inclusion in health, biomedical, behavioral, and STEM fields that build individual and institutional capacity to achieve excellence, foster innovation, and ensure equity in health locally, nationally, and globally.

About DICP:

The Office for Diversity Inclusion and Community Partnership (DICP) was established in 2002 (originally named Faculty Development and Diversity, est. 1995) to promote the increased recruitment, retention and advancement of diverse faculty, particularly individuals from groups underrepresented in medicine (URM), at HMS and to oversee all diversity activities involving Harvard Medical School (HMS) faculty, trainees, students and staff.

This is achieved through efforts that support the career development of junior faculty and fellows; train leaders in academic medicine and health policy; provide programs that address crucial pipeline issues, and sponsor awards and recognitions that reinforce behaviors and practices that are supportive of diversity, inclusion, mentoring, and faculty development. In addition, DICP activities support the Faculty Development and Diversity Task Force recommendations, particularly as they relate to mentoring, professional development and the design, creation and monitoring of workforce metrics. DICP also acts as a central resource for faculty development and diversity efforts of Harvard Catalyst | The Harvard Clinical and Translational Science Center through the Program for Faculty Development and Diversity Inclusion (PFDD).

Minority Faculty Development Program:

Recognizing the importance of addressing issues that impact faculty recruitment, impede faculty advancement and thwart faculty retention, in 1990, HMS initiated the Minority Faculty Development Program (MFDP). The MFDP, a component of DICP, offers consistent programming that is responsive to identified needs of individuals and institutions and serves as a nexus for collaborative work among HMS, HMS-affiliate faculty development programs and/or diversity/multicultural affairs offices. In addition, MFDP addresses issues of increasing the pool of minority and disadvantaged students interested in careers in science and medicine, and has built a three-pronged effort to encourage URM and disadvantaged students from all levels of the educational pipeline to pursue biomedical, STEM and health-related careers. Programs begin as early as the middle school level and carry on through the postgraduate level and involve curriculum development, teacher training, enhancing student research, and career development. DICP/MFDP's work addresses HMS' relationship with the community (internal and external) through the provision of programs that link HMS faculty, trainees and students with local, regional and national community-related activities.

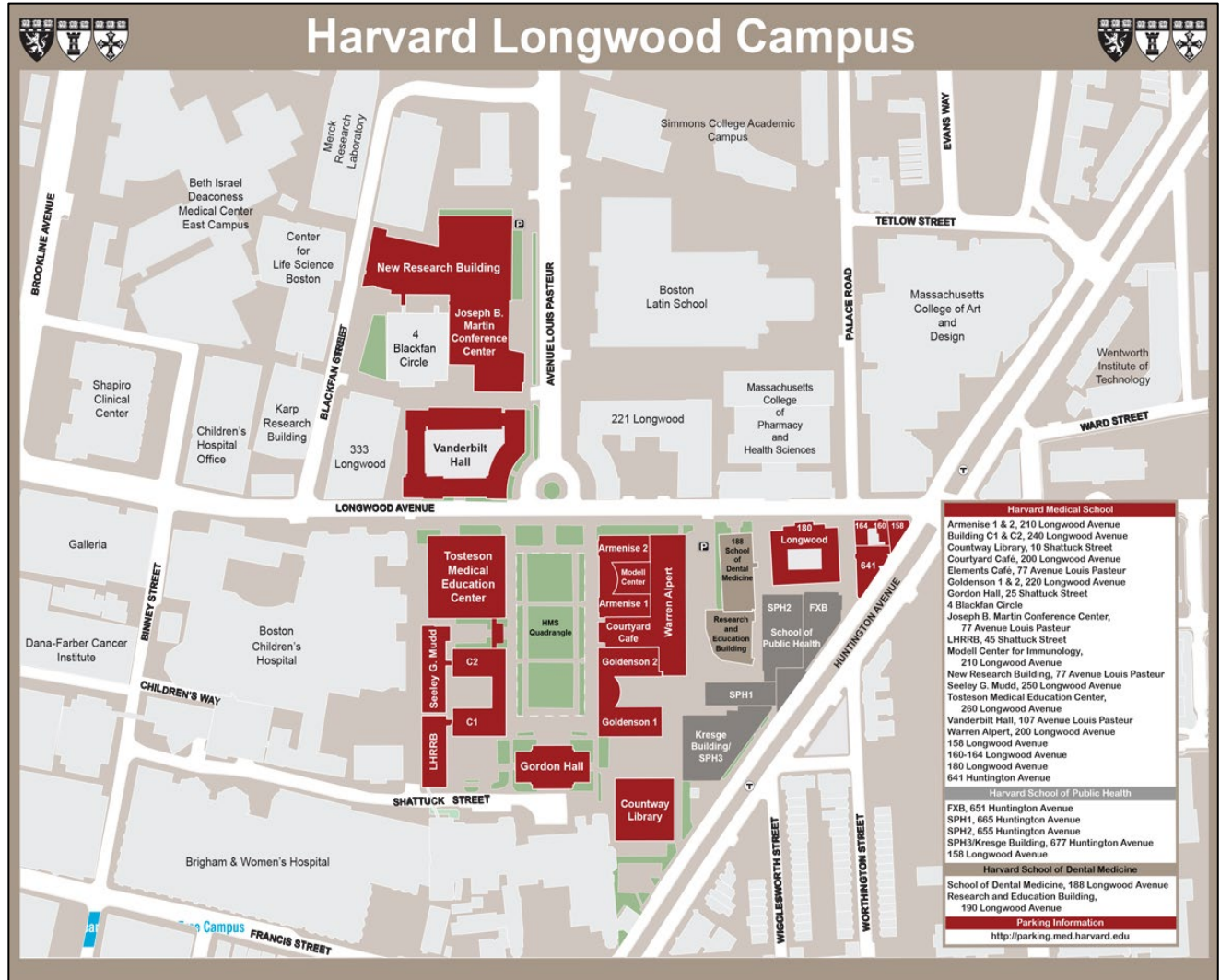

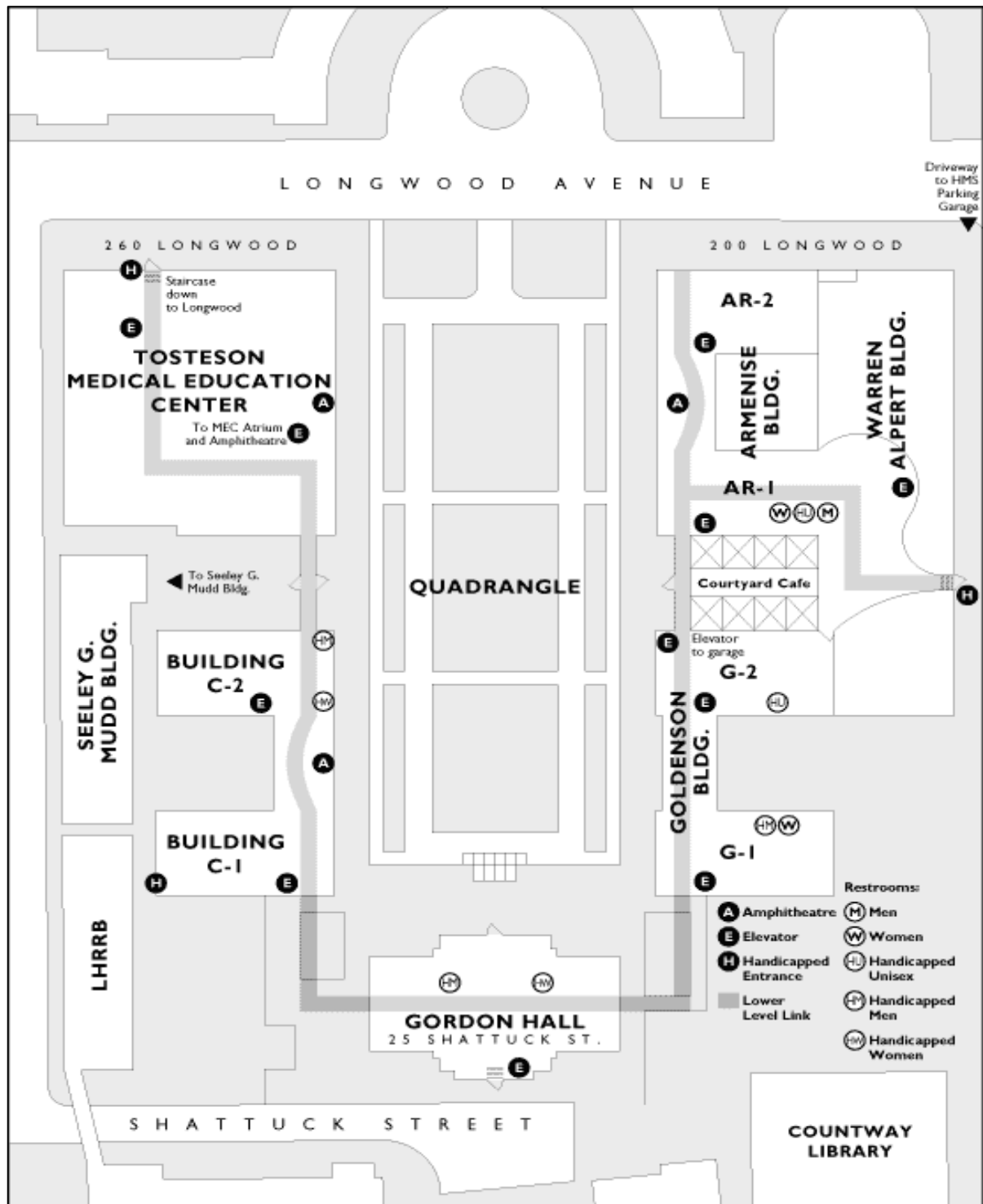

CAMPUS & TRANSPORTATION MAPS

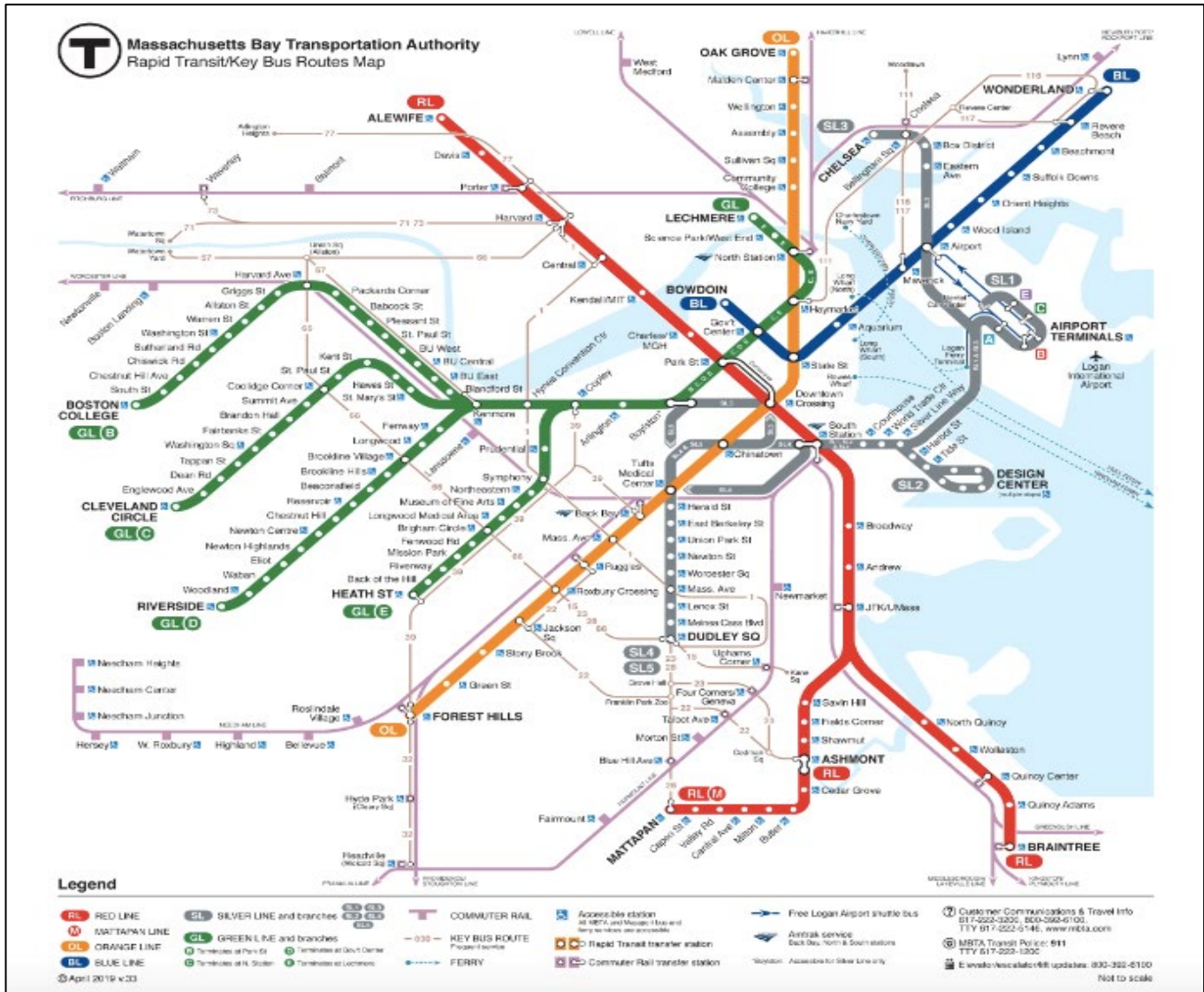
HARVARD LONGWOOD CAMPUS MAP



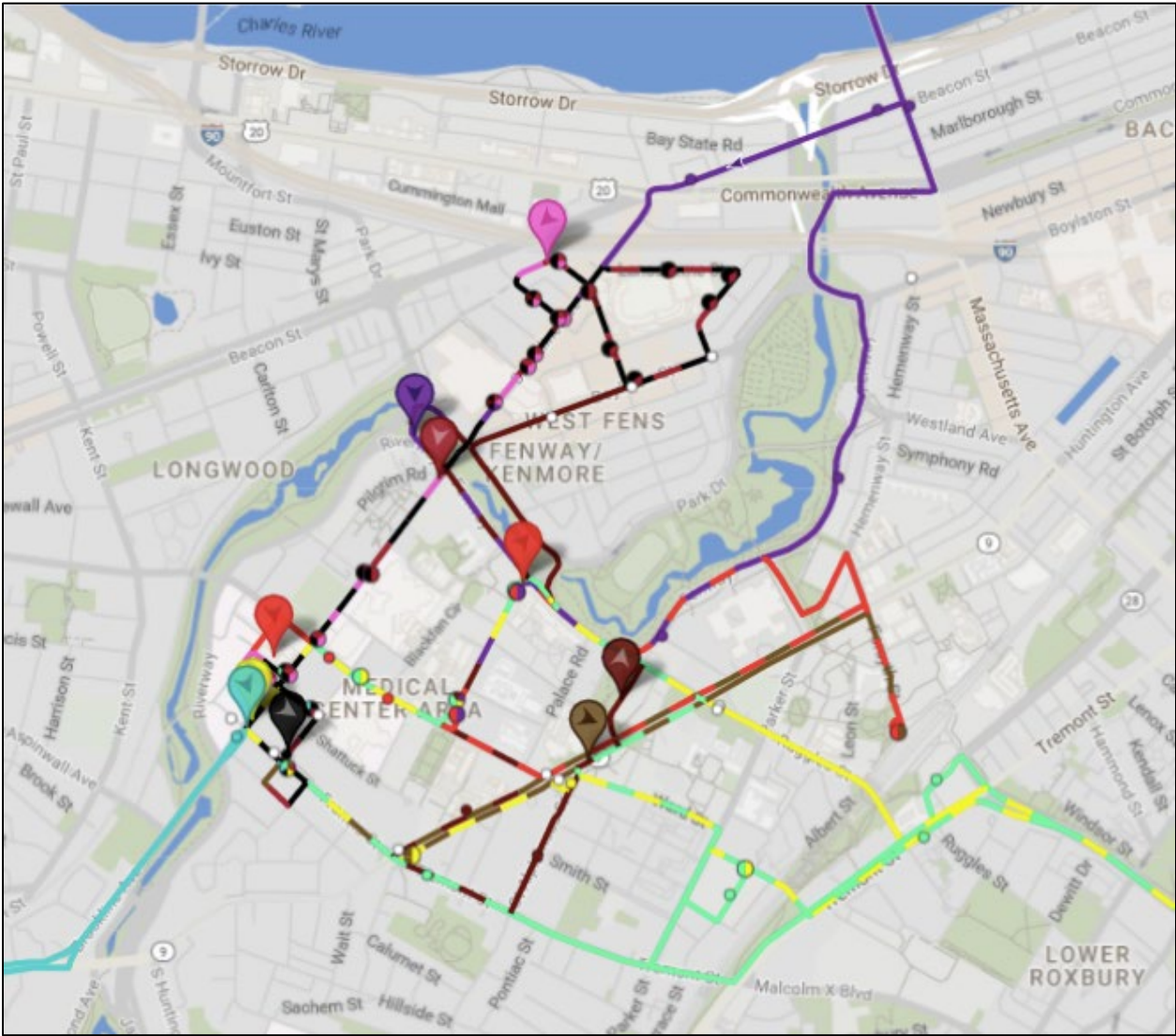
HARVARD MEDICAL SCHOOL QUADRANGLE MAP

DIRECTIONS BY CAR TO LONGWOOD MEDICAL AREA:

From South of Boston

Take I-93 North to exit 26 (Cambridge / Storrow Drive). Keep left at the end of ramp and take underpass to Storrow Drive. Follow Storrow Drive approximately 2.5 miles to Kenmore Square exit (on left). Bear right at the end of exit ramp into Kenmore Square. Take leftmost fork at intersection onto Brookline Avenue. Follow Brookline Avenue approximately 2 miles (Beth Israel Hospital will be on left). Watch for blue and white Longwood Medical Area signs.

From West of Boston

Take I-90 East (Massachusetts Turnpike) to exit 18 (Cambridge / Allston). Bear right after toll booth at end of exit ramp. Turn right after lights (before the bridge) onto Storrow Drive. Follow Storrow Drive (about one mile) to Kenmore Square exit. Bear right at end of exit ramp into Kenmore Square. Take the leftmost fork at intersection onto Brookline Avenue. Follow Brookline Avenue approximately 2 miles (Beth Israel Hospital will be on left). Watch for blue and white Longwood Medical Area signs.

From North of Boston

Take I-93 South to exit 26 (Storrow Drive / North Station). Keep left at end of ramp and take underpass to Storrow Drive. Follow Storrow Drive approximately 2.5 miles to Kenmore Square exit (on left). Bear right at the end of exit ramp into Kenmore Square. Take leftmost fork at intersection onto Brookline Avenue. Follow Brookline Avenue approximately 2 miles (Beth Israel Hospital will be on left). Watch for blue and white Longwood Medical Area signs.

From Logan Airport

Take Rte, 1A South through Sumner Tunnel after leaving the airport. Watch for detour signs that periodically direct traffic north before allowing access to Rte, 1A south. After tunnel, turn right onto I-93 N. Follow I-93 N about ¼ mile to exit 26 (Cambridge / Storrow Drive). Keep left at end of ramp and take underpass to Storrow Drive. Follow Storrow Drive approximately 2.5 miles to Kenmore Square exit (on left). Bear right at the end of exit ramp into Kenmore Square. Take leftmost fork at intersection onto Brookline Avenue. Follow Brookline Avenue approximately 2 miles (Beth Israel Hospital will be on left). Watch for blue and white Longwood Medical Area signs.

SUBWAY/TRAIN

The **Green** Line and **Orange** Line are the closest subway lines. The **D (Riverside)** and the **E (Arboretum)** lines both have **Longwood** stops. For more information, please go to www.mbta.com. The closest **Orange** line stop is **Ruggles (Northeastern)**, a 10 – 15 minute walk from the Longwood medical area. You can pay by Charlie Ticket or cash for single rides (\$2.75) or you can purchase a plastic CharlieCard and load a monthly T-pass on it. Using a CharlieCard the cost is \$2.25 a ride with free subway and bus transfers.

MBTA

Supplementing the rapid transit system are the MBTA buses. The buses provide cross-town service, run local routes in the city and suburbs, and connect the city with outlying areas. Bus fare for most routes is \$2.00 or \$1.70 with a CharlieCard (some of the longer routes and express routes cost more). Unlike transferring between connecting rapid transit lines, you must pay again when transferring from one bus to another or between rapid transit and buses. Get a T-Pass, either the Charlie Ticket which you can purchase at a T station or a CharlieCard which you can load with a monthly T-Pass and receive free bus transfers. NEIGHBORHOOD DESCRIPTIONS

Back Bay

Characterized by its old-fashioned brownstone houses, Parisian-style boulevards, tree-lined sidewalks, trendy shops, and tourist attractions, the Back Bay is a beautiful place to live. Back Bay features Copley Square, The Boston Common and Gardens, and the Charles River. Newbury Street is also located in the Back Bay, which boasts some of Boston's best shopping. Advantages of Back Bay include its proximity to BU's Medical Campus, offering many students the opportunity to either walk or bike to school. As with everything that is good, it has its drawbacks. Parking is very difficult, and the rent can tend to get a bit expensive. The area stretches from the heart of BU's Charles River campus to the Boston Gardens.

Beacon Hill

Located in the heart of Boston, Beacon Hill is home to Suffolk University, Massachusetts General Hospital, and a short walk from the Financial District and Government Center. The area features 19th and 20th century brownstones, cobblestone streets, old-fashioned narrow alleyways and occasional park-like areas with big trees. Because of its central location and Charles Street "T" stop on the Red Line, Beacon Hill also allows easy access to all of Boston's activities. Consequently, this desirable, historic area is crowded, expensive, and the apartments are usually small. Due to narrow streets and overcrowding, parking is minimal.

Brookline Village

Brookline Village is one of the neighborhoods in Brookline that is within walking distance of the Longwood Medical Area, going south on Brookline Avenue. Here, too, you will find a wide range of ethnic and specialty restaurants. It is accessible by the subway. (Brookline Village stop on the D Green Line).

Coolidge Corner

One of the two neighborhoods in Brookline that are very close to the Longwood Medical Area, the other being Brookline Village. There is a wide range of ethnic and specialty restaurants here, and a variety of shops selling shoes, clothes, books and gifts. It is accessible by subway (Coolidge Corner train on the Green Line) and by bus (Route 66, 65 and 60).

Dorchester

As Boston's largest community, Dorchester remains very much a residential neighborhood. Due to its size, Dorchester has several smaller communities within it. Rental prices in Dorchester are generally reasonable. Regal Victorians, triple-deckers, and waterfront spots in Savin Hill and Columbia Point offer an array of housing choices. Portions of Dorchester near the Harbor tend to be more expensive than their inland and more densely populated counterparts. . Transportation along the Red Line is reliable and traveling time depends on the location and time of day, usually around 10-25 minutes. Some buses also pass by Boston Medical Center and Dudley Square Bus Station.

Fenway

The Fenway, perhaps best known as the home for the "boys of summer," is more than just a ballpark. It is actually a dense urban neighborhood with a considerable amount of green space (the "Fens"). Although the Fenway consists of a large number of college students, it also contains a significant population of professionals, young and old. The famous, or infamous, Lansdowne Street, bordering the Mass Pike on the North and Fenway Park on the South, is home to many of Boston's most popular clubs and watering holes. If you travel the street, however, keep your eyes open for the occasional home run ball that clears the green monster.

Jamaica Plain

At the southern edge of Boston, there lies an inclusive and diverse location. A place where art and ideas are shared freely. It is a dynamic community with the luxury of a beautiful neighborhood. The hustle and bustle on Centre Street is balanced by the cool breeze off Jamaica pond and the enhancing greenery in the Arnold Arboretum.

Mission Hill

Once filled with farms and most of the breweries in Boston, Mission Hill today is an architectural landmark district with a combination of freestanding houses built by early wealthy landowners, blocks of traditional brick row houses, and many triple deckers. Many families and some students and staff from the nearby Longwood Medical Area come to Mission Hill for the affordable rents. A diverse community in proximity to downtown, Mission Hill offers its residents an excellent view of the neighborhood.

(NEIGHBORHOODS CONT'D)

Roxbury

A drive through Roxbury is both a history lesson and a tour of a modern urban neighborhood. One of the oldest neighborhoods in Boston, Roxbury has long thrived on its proximity to downtown while retaining its neighborhood qualities. Home to a great number of parks, schools and churches, a visitor can see Boston's history in the architecture and landmarks of the neighborhood. At the same time, Roxbury is a thriving community with a multitude of housing options and a variety of ethnic shops.

South End

Boston Medical Center is located in the South End, so the commute to school, in most cases, is a short walk or bike ride and very convenient. The area is undergoing a renovation and redevelopment, and some beautiful old homes from the past century are being restored, Victorian brick row houses.

SEASONS

Winter

Winter weather in New England, although beautiful, is not always pleasant as it tends to be quite long and cold. We average only about 5 hours of sunlight per day, in November, December and January. The average temperature during winter months, (November through March) is about 36 degrees Fahrenheit. New England tends to have the most rain during the winter months as well, averaging about 10 inches during the winter. If new to the area, it is always best to remember to wear a lot of layers during the winter months and keep an umbrella in close proximity!

Spring

Spring, (March through May) is usually on the cooler side at the beginning, since winter never seems to want to leave New England! The average temperature is around 48 degrees Fahrenheit. However, when it does warm up toward the middle and latter portions, Boston is quite delightful. Spring, too, tends to be a bit on the wet side with an average of 3.5 inches of rain during these months. A sweater and umbrella are always smart things to leave the house with.

Summer

Summer in New England is humid at times but it is mostly very enjoyable. There are all sorts of festivals, farmers markets and events going on outdoors during this time. The average temperature during Summer (June through August) is about 71 degrees Fahrenheit. Summer definitely cures the effects of Seasonal Affective Disorder with an average of 10 hours of sunlight per day. Boston averages only about 3 inches of rain during these months so put away the umbrella and pull out the shorts! All good things must come to an end, so enjoy the three months of summer because Fall arrives as soon as September does.

Fall

If you are a "leaver," or someone who enjoys the fall foliage, then you are definitely going to appreciate fall in and around Boston. With crisp, sunny days and cool nights, fall wear includes sweaters and fleeces. With an average of 3.5 inches of rain, it's also a good time to bring back the umbrella.
